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Preface: Explanation of Procedures

This manual is intended to make available the sources, the body of information, and some of the products of the grammatical study which produced the article, "The Classification of Optatives: A Statistical Study", GTJ, Vol. 9 No. 1, Spring, 1988. The article necessarily dealt with results, summaries, conclusions of the study, but it could not present the actual lists of examples of each classification and its sub-divisions, nor the detailed individual decisions which produced them. Since scholars may want to check these, this manual of background material is presented. Also, the lists may well be used to carry the study further.

To aid in the use of the manual, I offer this explanation of the procedures used. The first step was a GRAMCORD-generated list of all the optative verb forms in the Greek NT. To this list was added by personal editing a classification code arrived at by the writer through a study of each of these optatives in its context, marking its functional use. In addition to this, other tags were added to make sorting and further study possible (for an explanation of these see "Key to Classification Codes"). Then by use of a computerized sorting procedure a series of listings was produced, bringing together all the examples assigned to each functional classification. These were further studied and compared, subjected to further sorting of relevant material within each class. From the information thus collected the article was written.

This becomes the fifth and last in a series of such manuals developed to supplement the series of articles which have appeared in the GTJ on the moods of NT Greek verbs. The first four include the participles, the infinitives, the subjunctives, and the imperatives. They are all available to those

interested from the library of Grace Theological Seminary on request.
